

Dillon Beach Emergency Instructions

What to Do in an Earthquake or Similar Emergency

In the event of an earthquake causing significant damage or similar emergency you should report to your assigned shed, as described below, but before leaving your house there are four things you need to do:

First: check yourself and others in your household for physical well-being and perform necessary first aid to your ability.

Second: check your house for structural problems and for gas and water leaks. Turn off utilities if leaks are found.

Third: if you need help, place your “HELP” sign in a front window or other location where it can be seen from the street. Keep in mind that, if the emergency is widespread, calling 911 may not be an option. (If you do not already have a sign, contact us at DillonBeachERT@gmail.com and we will get one to you.)

Fourth: if you don’t need help, place the “OK” sign in your front window and proceed to your assigned DBERT shed so you can assist neighbors who do need help.

Where is your assigned shed?

Village (Including Cliff Street & Bay Drive) and The Landing

- **Beach Avenue** – behind the small building directly across the street from the store parking lot.
 - Occupants of the tiny houses and day beach users
- **21 Summer Street** – at the back of the lot
 - all addresses in the village
- **The Landing** - take the turn-off closest to the entrance and go up the slight hill to the east
 - all campers and others at The Landing
 - all addresses on Cliff Street south of the day beach
 - all addresses on Bay Drive

In addition, there will be a DBERT volunteer at the Post Office who can direct you to the place that most needs the help you are able to offer.

Oceana Marin (Including Unit 1)

Go to the shed to which you are assigned by addresses below:

- **Tahiti Shed** – in the cul-de-sac adjacent to the sewage pumping station.
 - Tahiti Way – all addresses
 - Lanai Way – all addresses
 - Kailua Way – all addresses
 - Oceana Drive – entrance through 360, except for 325, 345, and 365
- **Mid-Oceana Shed** – on the ocean side of Oceana Drive between Maui and Kona.
 - Oceana Drive – 325, 345, 365, and 380 through 511
 - Kameha Way – all addresses
 - Maui Way – all addresses
 - Kona Lane – all addresses
- **Waikiki Shed** – on Oceana Drive directly across from the intersection with Waikiki
 - Oceana Drive – 516 through 591
 - Waikiki Lane – all addresses
